VIII POLISH POLE & AERIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS 2025



RULES

1. Organizer

The organizer of the VIII Polish Pole & Aerial Championships, hereinafter referred to as the "Competition", is the Association of the Polish Pole Sport Community, registered on 12.04.2016, KRS number 0000611147, with its registered office in Katowice, hereinafter referred to as the "Organizer".

2. **Date and place**

The competition will take place on:

<u>April 3 -6, 2025</u> for the following disciplines: pole sport, artistic pole, ultra pole, para pole, artistic aerial hoop;

<u>June 12 – 15, 2025</u> for disciplines: aerial hoop sport, aerial pole sport, artistic aerial pole;

The organizer reserves the right **to postpone** a given **discipline between the dates**, if the situation after the end of the applications, related to the number of registered competitors, requires it. The announcement of the postponement of a given discipline will be made immediately after the completion of applications on the Organizer's social media profiles and on the website. When applying, the athlete is obliged to take this fact into account and be ready to start during other date. The exact schedule and starting numbers of the competitors for the given dates will be announced two weeks before each of them.

The competition will take place in the 'Spodek' gymnasium, Aleja W. Korfantego 35, 40-005 Katowice

3. **Championship Form**

The Polish Championships will be held in the form of stationary competition. Due to unforeseen random events on a national scale or possible restrictions, the Organizer reserves the right to cancel the Polish Championships only when it is the utmost necessity. It may also mean limiting the number of seats in the audience or excluding spectators from attending the event. In the event of cancellation of the Championships due to the fault of the Organizer, the entry fees will be refunded to the competitors within a maximum of one month from the date of the competition that was canceled.

4. **Regulations**

The VIII Polish Pole & Aerial Championship is approved by the International Pole and Aerial Sports Federation and is played as a qualification for the IPSF World Championship, which is equivalent to using the rules and regulations of the IPSAF as the rules for the competition.

The Athlete is obliged to read these Regulations, the relevant IPSAF Points Codes for 2025, the Code of Ethics and the IPSAF Rules and Regulations and apply for the Competition on their basis. All documents are available on the http://www.pspolesport.pl/dokumenty,i17.html website. The Athlete is obliged to check the validity of the documents on the PSPS and IPSAF websites and to prepare according to their latest updates. The Organizer will inform the group of competitors about the update of the documents. The Competitor is obliged to remember that **the English version of the Codes** is the final version.

5. **Athletes**

A competitor taking part in the Open categories can be a person who is a citizen of a country where competitions approved by the International Pole and Aerial Sports Federation are not held. A citizen of a country where IPSAF-approved competitions do not take place but has a document confirming a temporary residence permit in









Poland, employment, school/university attendance or similar, may represent Poland if the previous year he/she did not take part in IPSAF-approved competitions as a representative of another country. In such a case, the application must be completed for national categories (not Open).

6. **Association of Schools/Studios/Clubs**

Open competitors are not obliged to join or represent a Polish club/studio.

7. **Participation**

In order to ensure maximum safety for everyone, each participant (including accompanying persons) is obliged to appear at the competition site only in the absence of any symptoms of illness or health complications. In the event of resignation from the competition after the final date of resignation, the competitor is obliged to provide medical documents confirming the inability to participate in the competition, in accordance with the provisions of the No Show Policy (in the Points Codes). Cancellation of the competition at any time and for any reason will result in no refund of fees.

8. Categories & Sections

A detailed description of the categories and sections can be found in the International Pole and Aerial Sports Federation's Rules and Regulations, contained in the respective Points Codes of the discipline in question. In the application, the competitor chooses the section and category appropriate to his experience and age category. The consequence of entering the wrong section/category is disqualification (see HJ Penalties in the Codes of Points). In the case of applying for different disciplines, the athlete chooses a section according to experience for each of them. The section of a competitor in different categories in the same discipline must be the same. For Open competitiors only the highest sections are accessible.

9. **Applications and deadlines**

Applications for the Polish Pole & Aerial Championships 2025 can be made electronically, via the application form available on the http://www.pspolesport.pl/zgloszenia,i267.html Applications for the open athletes is in English and will be open only on the following dates, i.e. on the following dates:

December 12, 2024 – January 10, 2025 for all disciplines. The deadline for applications is: **January 10, 2025, at 11:59 p.m.**

After filling out the application form, the system automatically sends a confirmation of sending the questionnaire to the e-mail address provided in the application. If you do not receive such an e-mail, please report this fact within 24 hours of filling in the form, to zawody@pspolesport.pl address only after checking the SPAM folder, with the title 'REPORT'. Otherwise, the entry will be considered ineffective and potential fees will not be refunded.

Each entry is for one discipline. If you wish to enter multiple disciplines, you must submit a separate entry for each discipline.

The application for participation in the competition must contain all the necessary documents listed in point 10 of the Regulations. In case of submitting the application after the deadline or incomplete application, the competitor will not be included in the start lists and the fees will not be refunded.

(Aerial Hoop Sport, Aerial Pole Sport, Artistic Aerial Pole)

June 12-15, 2025 — VIII Polish Pole & Aerial Championships 2025 for the disciplines: aerial hoop sport, aerial pole sport, artistic aerial pole; June 24, 2025 — announcement of the final plan and starting numbers;

June 21, 2025 – deadline for final resignation; May 8, 2025 – deadline for sending forms;

April 24, 2025 – deadline for submitting forms for review by HJ*

*the date may be changed after the assignment of HJ and consultations; the change of date will be given on the group of competitors:

April 13, 2025 – deadline for sending music; **January 31, 2025** – deadline for sending WADA certificates;

December 12, 2024 – January 10, 2025 – deadline for accepting applications for the Polish Championships;

10. **Documents**

The application form will be available on-line at http://www.pspolesport.pl/zgloszenia,i267.html You will be able to apply by providing the required data and the following attachments:

- Confirmation of payment of the entry fee;
- A photo of the athlete's face or silhouette (exotic or similar photos are not acceptable);

Accident insurance is also required for the start, which must be presented when registering before the competition.

11. Entry and membership fee

<u>The entry fee</u> for participation in the competition is EUR 80.00 – soloists; EUR 130.00 – duets; EUR 60/person – groups (payable depending on the number of people in the group);

The entry fee includes a ticket for the competitor, valid on the day of the start. Approved IPSAF Trainers receive free tickets only after sending a certificate, valid for 2025 for zawody@pspolesport.pl with the title of 'IPSF Coach'

Each entry is for a start in one discipline. If you want to take part in different disciplines, you need to send a separate application to each of them.









Fees are not refunded in the event of a competitor's resignation from the start at any time and for any reason.

12. A group for the athletes

All current information is sent to the athletes through the group for athletes on facebook. The address of the group of competitors will be provided by the Organizer after accepting the application. The group is available only to athletes, guardians of underage athletes and coaches approved by the IPSAF. In case of resignation of a parent from representing an underage player in a group of athletes, the parent may transfer the opportunity to participate in the group to a coach who is not approved. Such information should be sent by e-mail to zawody@pspolesport.pl. Only correctly completed applications to the group (indicating all sub-points and acceptance of the group's regulations) will be accepted. The absence of the athlete and/or the player's legal guardian may result in the lack of access to the necessary information.

13. Athlete's Tracksuits

In accordance with the current IPSAF regulations, each competitor must wear tracksuits specified in the appropriate guidelines. In accordance with the guidelines for national federations, all competitors who do not have tracksuits in accordance with the IPSAF guidelines will have uniform federation tracksuits. If you do not have a tracksuit that complies with the guidelines in the Points Code, you will be awarded negative points.

14. Judging

Competitions approved by the IPSAF are always refereed by trained, certified referees of the International Pole and Aerial Sports Federation. The panel(s) of judges will be announced once they have been assigned to the national championships by the IPSAF.

15. Music and performance time

Details on the choice of music and performance times can be found in the Points Code Rules and Regulations for 2025. Point Codes are available at http://www.pspolesport.pl/dokumenty,i17.html

16. Makeup, Hair, Grips, Scene, Poles, Filming

For information on hair and makeup, grips, scenes, poles, and filming, please refer to the Rules and Regulations. Stage dimensions for pole: 6m x 9m; for aerial: 6m x 6m

17. **Disqualification**

The reasons why a competitor may be disqualified are listed in point 20 of the Rules and Regulations and in the HJ Penalties.

18. Antydoping

An Athlete is required to comply with WADA's anti-doping rules and not to use any agents from the list available on www.ipsfsports.org. Each athlete participating in the Polish Championships is obliged to complete a free anti-doping course for athletes, available at the https://adel.wada-ama.org/

19. **Protest**

The competitor has the right to lodge a protest. The rules and procedure are described in Section 25 of the Rules and Regulations.

20. Final provisions

The Organizer reserves the right to amend the Regulations and immediately inform all interested parties about the changes.
